campaign launched in 2020 to recognize the ongoing dedication of veterans and service members who continue to serve their communities. VFW Day of Service, led by veterans and in concert with other organizations and civic groups, is open for anyone to participate. The inaugural VFW Day of Service kicks off the first Saturday in May (May 7), marking the start of veteran-led community service projects to take place throughout the month.

"The positive feedback from VFW members and the communities we serve tells us the stage is set to expand our <u>#StillServing</u> initiative," said Fritz Mihelcic, VFW national commander. "We have already seen how the campaign amplifies the volunteer efforts and camaraderie of America's veterans. The time is now to take its visibility to the next level."

Veterans are more likely than civilians to volunteer in their communities, according to a recent civic health survey1 of veterans. The same study showed veterans donate to charities, register to vote, and are involved in their communities and local government at a greater rate than their civilian counterparts.

"We are calling on all VFW Posts and members across America and around the world to join in the VFW Day of Service by planning an activity for May 7, or at another point during the month, to show that we never stop serving" said Mihelcic.

The VFW urges its members and all veterans to visit <u>VFWDayofService.org</u> to register their event on the interactive Day of Service map and receive a special participation decal, or find a local event to join and see what other veterans around the country are doing to make a difference.

Our continued success is dependent on all of us working together to support our veterans and our communities. As we work together, we can take pride in our accomplishments knowing that together as Comrades and members of the VFW we have met the challenges put before us and that 'NO ONE DOES MORE FOR VETERANS THAN THE VFW'. Thank you and God bless you for your service to our great country and your continued service to your community! 





### **Old Armory**

Hi my name is Stryder Kibbe I am 16 years old and I live in Plentywood, Montana. The photos below are of the Old Armory in our town. It was built in 1946, Company "C" 163rd Infantry. The Company made up of 19 men, 3 officers made up the Charter members, Capt. Arvild J. Christiansen was the first commanding officer, Then the unit was reorganized on March 1st 1953 it was redesigned as a Howitzer Battery 1st Recon. Sq., when the State National Guard changed from Infantry to Armed Cavalry. On January 1st 1960 the unit moved into the newly constructed Armory. In 1972 the unit was then reorganized again to :HOW BATTERY 1st Recon. Sqdn. 1/163AC and then on December 1st 1976 it became a Detachment Known as DET 2 TRP B 1/163 AC MT ARNG, With Sidney MT the Headquarters unit, with reorganization of the Montana National Guard in 1999 The Unit was Disbanded and moved to Culbertson. 22 years later a young man noticed a flag pole at the old armory site knowing something had to be done he had decided to buy rope and a flag and with a little help a American Flag had been risen over the Armory for the first time in 22 years this young man was me, I had decided to dedicate the raising of the flag over the Armory to Honor all Veterans of Montana and to those who served in that armory. As a closing quote "Our Flag Does Not Fly Due to Wind, it Flies with the Last Breath of the Soldiers Who Died Protecting it."

The top ten (10) All-State Post Commanders and Quartermasters (5 each) will receive an All-State Commanders Cap and Lapel Pin/All-State Quartermaster Cap and Lapel pin. One (1) of the All-State Commanders will be selected as Captain and will receive an All-State Commanders Captain Cap. If your Post is not 100% by April 30, 2022 but is 100% by June 30, 2022 and you otherwise qualify for All-State Commander, Quartermaster the All-State star will be presented at a later date and an All-State cap can be ordered through the State Quartermaster at the officer or Post's expense.

NOTE: If you already own an All-State cap for this position, you will be offered a special insignia, a Gold Star, to place on your current cap instead of receiving a new cap. This will allow the next Commander in line to receive his/her first cap. As can be deduced from above the Department will only purchase ten (10) caps and unlimited Gold Stars. This does not limit the number of All-State Commanders that may be recognized. If a Commander qualifies for All-State but falls out of the ten All-State Cap limits, it will be required for the Commander / Quartermaster's Post to purchase an All-State cap if so desired. #### **ALL-STATE DISTRICT COMMANDERS**

The highest scoring District Commander, will be selected as All-State District Commander, Captain. And will receive a special All-State District Commanders Cap. If District is not 100% by April 30, 2022 but is 100% by June 30, 2022 The All-State cap will be presented at a later date as long as you qualify for All-State.



To qualify for All-State the District must complete the following: Each Post in the District <u>MUST</u> be inspected by 15 October 2021.

2. The following criteria and points will be used to determine the All-State District Commanders.

NOTE: If you already own an All-State cap for this position, you will be offered a special insignia, a Gold Star, to place on your current cap instead of receiving a new cap. This will allow the next Commander in line to receive his/her first cap. As can be deduced from above the Department will only purchase two (2) caps and unlimited Gold Stars. This does not limit the number of All-State District Commanders that may be recognized. If a District Commander qualifies for All-State but falls out of the two All State Cap limit, however it will be required for the District Commanders / Quartermaster's District to purchase an All-State cap if so desired. All-State Caps must be ordered through Department Headquarters.

#### **All-American Criteria**

The All-American program exists to recognize exceptional leadership and teamwork, authentic accomplishment in membership growth and VFW core programs.

#### All-American Post Criteria

- Membership greater than 100%<sup>o</sup>
- Meet all the following Program Participation Criteria:
  - Voice of Democracy minimum of one entry advanced to District judging (Overseas Post can donate \$75 to National in lieu of entry)
  - Patriots Pen minimum of one enotry advanced to District judging (Overseas Post can donate \$75 to National in lieu of entry)
  - Hold a fundraiser with the proceeds going to Veterans & Military Support Programs Services, minimum of \$100.
  - Partner twice with two separate organizations like Team RWB, Operation Ramp It Up, Operation Gratitude, Team Rubicon, Merging Vets & Players and other VSOs to include our friends at Sport Clips and Burger King. (Submit both online reports through dashboard).
  - ° Create Post social media site or actively maintain existing site.
  - o 5 New Action Corps Sign-Ups: To sign up: Text "VFW" to "50457" to sign-up 5 previously unsubscribed members or VFW supporters.
  - Have a 10% increase in total impact in Community Service.

- Reserved seating at the VFW National Convention joint opening session.




### **VFW Post 6786**
