

SUICIDE AWARENESS PROMINENT IN PLAINS By Heather Allen



Every September, for suicide awareness month, VFW Post 3596 Life Member, Edward Foste creates a Veteran Suicide Awareness display on the greenway along Hwy 200 in Plains, MT. He started with a Veteran organization out of Missoula containing a static display in 2018 featuring two white crosses and a Star of David. The following year, with that organization no longer active, he made the display his own. In the back center of the display is a large cross with a green line American Flag that gets more distressed every year. He plans to keep it distressed because of the struggles within our Veterans who take their own lives. With that, 660 American flags are added in front of it throughout the month. Every flag represents a veteran who completed suicide that day. Various veterans, community members, children (young and old) and political figures have all joined Ed each day of every September to add 22 new flags for that day. He added a silhouette of a kneeling soldier in 2019 and in 2020 he added a female kneeling soldier to the display. In 2021 he changed them from black silhouettes to distressed silhouettes to signify the struggle within Veterans around us.

This year, the display grew even bigger. He talked with local businesses and asked them if they wanted to be a part of suicide awareness month. Twelve businesses and one family all provided supporting banners to hang on the fence behind his growing display. He also asked if the Suicide Awareness truck could be part of the display, which was a resounding yes. Each weekend the truck left on a mission to the VFW District meetings around the state then came back to the display, changing positions each time. On the final day, he had WWII Veteran Tom Charlton help him add the large flags down the center. He has future plans to add silhouettes of children and other family members to represent the Green Star Families, which are the family members the departed Veteran has left behind.

On Sept 5,2023 Past President Tamee Havrilla, presented a check in the amount of \$3,333.47, the total amount raised from her Special Project to help Grace Home. She presented the check to Deborah Kottel who serves as the Executive Director for St. Vincent De Paul of Cascade County.

For the past six years, the Grace Home Veterans Center in Great Falls has been working to change the lives of those who served our country.

This donation helps the organization to further enhance their mission.

"I chose Grace home because it was a great veteran's organization to donate to because they help veterans transition when they need help to when they leave the military and come into the civilian world," Havrilla stated.

Deborah Kottel said, "This is a significant donation for them, which will allow them to directly help men and women who are unhoused. You need housing in order to take the next step in your life. It's very hard to move your life forward when housed on the street."

Kottel noted that they have been at capacity every day since that time, serving 14 men with private rooms and robust support, such as literacy, financial support, and sobriety.

While Grace Home supports military men, there second facility, Grace Haven aims to support military women and their children.

"It was real clear to us that female veterans are eight times more likely to be homeless, unhoused, and have trauma" Kottel said. "Yet there was not one place in the state of Montana that was dedicated to female unhoused veterans. This is particularly difficult because many of the unhoused female veterans come with children. You have to have a facility that can also accommodate children."

Kottel emphasized that not a single penny of their donations goes to administration. "We run on a very tight budget. "We don't have federal funds. This is community support. No donation ever goes into administrative overheads. This will go to pay utility bills, pay insurance on the building, have a car that transports people to their job, direct counseling, treatment. It will go to those services."

Grace Haven is expected to open in November, located at 1220 17th Street South.

Any member who recruits five (5) or more New, New Life or Reinstated Members will be eligible for three (3) cash drawings of \$100.00 and one (1) cash drawing of \$250.00 at the State Convention. Recruiters will receive (1) chance for every (5) members recruited. Cutoff date April 30, 2024.

102% MEMBERSHIP PIN

Every Post Commander and Post Quartermaster who becomes 102% in Membership as recorded in the VFW Online Membership System (OMS), as of June 1, 2024, will receive a special 102% Membership Pin, Commander's Pin, Commander's Coin, and Commander-in-Chief Pin.

MEMBERSHIP

Each Post that reaches 88% in Membership by 30 September 2023, and or 93% in Membership by 31 October 2023, and or 100% in Membership by 30 November 2023 will be entered in a drawing for one of two \$100 awards at each benchmark. Additionally, each Post that reaches 102% in Membership by 31 December 2023 will be entered in a drawing for one of two \$500 awards. Awards to be drawn at the Mid-Winter meeting. (*Posts can qualify for more than one award*)

Each District that reaches 102% in membership by 31 December, 2023 will receive \$500 for your District.

The Department Commander will be contacting each District Commander monthly to receive updates on their District.

STATE COMMANDER'S MONTHLY CHALLENGE

July Challenge: The Post that has the largest percent of continuous annual members that pay their dues between 1 July and 31 July, 2023 will receive \$200 for their Post.

August Challenge: The Post that has the largest number of reinstated members to renew between 1 August and 31 August, 2023 will receive \$200 for their Post.

September Challenge: The Post that has the largest percent increase of paid members between 1 September and 30 September, 2023 will receive \$200 for their Post. (*excluding life members*)

October Challenge: The Post that has the largest number of annual members converted to life member between 1 October and 31 October, 2023 will receive \$200 for their Post.

November Challenge: The Post that recruits the largest number of new members between 1 November and 30 November, 2023 will receive \$200 for their Post.

December Challenge: The Post that has the largest number of new, reinstated, annual and life members paid between 1 December and 31 December, 2023 will receive \$200 for their Post.

POST LEGACY LIFE AWARD

The post with the largest increase in new and upgraded Legacy Life members for the year will receive \$400. A point system will be used to determine the winner. Posts will receive 1 point for each level increased and 4 points for each new Gold Legacy Life member i.e., bronze to silver = 1 point, bronze to gold = 2 points, new silver = 2 points, new gold = 4 points.

State Headquarters will use information from the Online Membership System (OMS). <u>Cutoff date will be 30 April 2024.</u>

ALL-STATE POST COMMANDERS & QUARTERMASTERS

To qualify for All-State Post Commander and Quartermaster the following requirements are established.

- 1. Your Post must be 102% in the Membership Program by June 30, 2024
- 2. Your Post must be inspected by 15 October, 2023.
- 3. Your Post must have Four (4) Quarterly Post Audits for the year April 1, 2023– March 31, 2024, on file with the Department Quartermaster. Specifically, the Quarterly Audits for the 2nd, 3rd and 4th Quarters, calendar year 2023 and the 1st, Quarter, of calendar year 2024 must be received before **30 April, 2024**. Any exception to this requirement must be addressed to the Department Quartermaster in advance of the report due date. Each audit is worth 25 points for a total of 100 points.

- 4. Your Post must have a representative at both the Fall and Spring District meetings.
- 5. Your Post must host or participate in a minimum of two (2) recruiting events and report results on the Community Activity Report or dashboard by **30 April 2024**.
- 6. Your Post must participate in a minimum of one (1) community service special project and report the results on the Community Activity Report by **30 April 2024.**
- 7. You must have a 2024–2025 Election Report on file at the Department Headquarters by **May 1, 2024**.
- 8. Must turn in at least one (1) community activity report quarterly to Department headquarters.
- 9. Posts that have failed to turn all documents in by the deadline will not be qualified for All-State.

ALL-STATE

The top ten (10) All-State Post Commanders and Quartermasters (5 each) will receive an All-State Commanders Cap or All-State Quartermaster Cap respectively. One (1) of the All-State Commanders will be selected as Captain and (1) of the All-State Quartermasters will be selected as Captain and will receive All-State Commanders/ Quartermaster Captain Caps. If your Post is not 102% by April 30, 2024 but is 102% by June 30, 2024 and you otherwise qualify for All-State Commander, Quartermaster the All-State star will be presented at a later date and an All-State cap can be ordered through the State Quartermaster at the officer or Post's expense.

NOTE: If you already own an All-State cap for this position, you will be offered a special insignia, a Gold Star, to place on your current cap instead of receiving a new cap. This will allow the next Commander in line to receive his/her first cap. As can be deduced from above the Department will only purchase ten (10) caps and unlimited Gold Stars. This does not limit the number of All-State Commanders that may be recognized.
